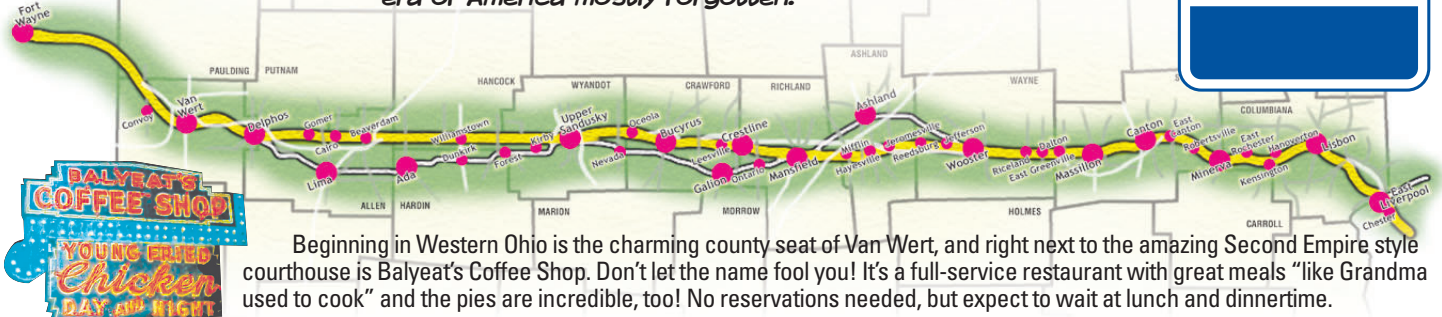

The Lincoln Highway was created in 1913 by several industrialists to become America's FIRST coast-to-coast "rock" highway, connecting New York with San Francisco and creating 3,389 miles of Main Streets across America. Take in the autumn splendors of this great "retro" road and re-discover an era of America mostly forgotten!

HISTORIC LISBON, OHIO
